ELECTRONIC PARKING BRAKE (EPB)

INFORMATION

Where fitted, the electronic parking brake replaces the mechanical handbrake and is designed to prevent the vehicle from accidently rolling away. This system offers convenience and safety features in addition to those normally associated with a mechanical handbrake. Please refer to the primary Vehicle Instruction Guide for information about other operational instructions.









LOCATION

The diagrams above indicate example locations of the electronic parking brake (A) which is labelled with the universal icon symbol: (P)



ACTIVATION

The EPB will normally auto activate. If will also activate if seat belts are not being worn, or when luggage placed on top of seats activates the system. To enable the system to function correctly, fasten seatbelts, and remove luggage from the seats and store it securely in the boot. Pull the switch labelled A to manually apply the parking brake. The warning lamps on both the switch and instrument panel will light up to confirm its activation.

DEACTIVATION

The EPB will normally auto release. Depress the brake or accelerator pedal to auto release it, or press the switch (A) to manually release it. The associated warning lamps on both the switch and dashboard instrument panel will go out to confirm its deactivation. *Note: seatbelts should be fastened, and luggage should not be placed on seats.*

WHEN DRIVING AWAY

The parking brake will deactivate automatically when driving away, and it also prevents the vehicle from rolling back unintentionally for a few seconds when starting on a gradient. This works by driving off in a normal way, the parking brake will automatically release and the vehicle will start moving in the desired direction.

On vehicles fitted with an automatic gear box, you can apply the parking brake when stopping briefly at traffic lights etc., to avoid the vehicle creeping forward. When you drive off the parking brake will be automatically released.

DEADLOCKS

Deadlock / safelock messages shown on the instrument display when the engine is turned off simply indicate that once you exit the vehicle and lock the doors, they're effectively deadlocked and anyone left in the car wouldn't be able to get out in the event of an emergency. The warning is nothing to worry about and is just a standard advisory message.

SEATBELT WARNING LIGHTS

A seatbelt warning light may illuminate when the engine is turned on. This may mean that the electronic parking brake (EPB) becomes auto activated to prevent vehicle movement. To deactivate these warning lights, and turn off the auto activation of the EPB in this instance, ensure all passengers fasten their seatbelts, and remove any luggage from on top of the seats. For safety secure all luggage inside the boot.

WARNING LIGHTS AND WHAT THEY MEAN

Don't panic! Despite seeing a new light pop-up on your instrument panel, unless it is red it is likely the car is still running fine, and while there may be a problem to attend to, proceed with confidence and patience.



> Key / remote control operated central high security dead locking. Keyless entry - just retain the key in your pocket or bag and doors will unlock. Depress the central locking switch on the driver's door to lock the doors from the inside. All doors will auto-lock on vehicle motion.

Anti-theft system? Opening boot/tailgate?

- > Passive arming of alarm and electronic engine immobiliser. Auto locking. Visible VIN.
- > Centrally locked. Use the key or remote control to unlock / open. Pull the release handle to open. The boot features a split level load level to accomodate various load depths. Some models may feature auto opening controlled by foot gesture activated sesnors under the rear bumper.

Adjusting door mirrors? Opening the windows? Operating the sunroof? Using child door locks?

- > Electric adjustment operated by the control pad on the driver's door.
- > Electric front and rear operated via control buttons on the driver's door.
- > If fitted: Electric tilt / slide glass panoramic sunroof operated by roof mounted switchgear.
- > Located on the edge of the rear doors, press the central locking switch to lock all doors, or twist the slot on edge of rear door to activate child proof locking on the door. Repeat the process for each rear door. Check from inside that the door is securely locked.

Starting the engine?

> Ensure gear selector is in neutral (or N or P if automatic) and parking brake is on. Depress the brake pedal. Keep the key in your pocket or bag, press the engine start/stop button to start or stop the engine. Vehicles also feature automatic engine start/stop technology - whereby the engine automatically shuts off when vehicle is not moving, gears are in neutral and foot pedals are not depressed - engine instantly restarts on depression of the clutch or accelerator. Select desired gear. Release parking brake and brake pedal and gently press the accelerator to move the vehicle. (Note: the parking brake will normally auto release).

Hybrid electric use?

> Hybrid electric motor can deliver up to 43 miles (69 kilometres) solely using electric power. Charging by Type 2 connector. Recharge time: 7 hours for domestic 2.2kW 3-pin plug (emergency use only); 6.5 hours for a 7kW AC installed home charger or 22kW AC public charger; and 3 hours for 7kW fast charger (50kW DC charger). Vehicle is equipped with a 13A domestic 3-pin charger with Type 2 connector for vehicle connection, and supports both Type 2 connector (for slow and fast charging) and CCS connector (for rapid charging). During charging the vehicle can be locked to protect against theft. Also, as part of the charging process, the charge cable is interlocked to the electric car so it can only be removed by driver.

Opening fuel filler cap?

> Important: Hold in the Electronic Release button located adjacent to the bonnet catch. Hold this button in until the dashboard says 'ready to fuel'. Then exit the vehicle, and push in the fuel flap cover located on rear nearside to release it. Twist off the cap anticlockwise. Fuel flap is centrally locked.

Releasing the bonnet? Folding the rear seats?

- > Pull bonnet release lever located at rear left of front passenger footwell. Unhook catch under bonnet.
- > The rear seat is divided into 60:40 sections which can be folded separately. To release the seat press the seat unlocking catch and fold the seat down. To return the seat to normal use, raise the seat and push it firmly to engage the seat lock. Check it is locked before using the seat.

How to change a tyre?

> Vehicles are not normally supplied with a spare wheel or tyre repair kit. For any assistance in the event of having a punctured tyre, or should the vehicle not be supplied with a spare wheel and tyre or a tyre repair kit, please call the Europcar Tyre Helpline 0800 0280 999.

How to drive an automatic? > Press the unlock button on the gear lever to shift between gears. Select N for neutral, P when leaving the vehicle, R for reversing (the vehicle must be at a complete standstill before this gear can be selected). For normal driving select D where the transmission will use all available forward gears automatically (a 'kickdown ' facility is provided when the accelerator is pressed all the way to the floor past the normal acceleration point forcing the transmission to select a lower gear to obtain maximum acceleration. Release pressure on the accelerator to return to normal accelerator use). Select the + or - options to manually change gears. Use the S mode for sportier gear responses. Whenever the vehicle is at a standstill apply the
